

Memorial Cross

At the edge of the mountain a cross was erected in honor of the members of the Sewanee community who had fought or died in World War I. Benjamin F. Finney, eighth Vice-Chancellor, is inspecting the work of Thomas Hamilton who was the supervisor on the job. Will Campbell, the only mason who worked on All Saints' Chapel in its beginning in 1904 and its recent completion, is shaping a piece of stone.
